RECOMMENDED USAGE:

Surface Preparation:

Ensure that the surface is polished, clean, dry, and free of dust, grease, and loose particles before application.

Application Areas:

Suitable for use on concrete surfaces, wood, plastered walls, and previously painted surfaces.

COVERAGE:

Coverage per Pail:

15-20 square meters (2 coats), depending on the surface's porosity and texture.

Recommended Coats:

2 coats for optimal waterproofing performance.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS:

3. Application Method:

Apply using a brush or roller.

Clean tools and equipment with water immediately after use.
